Improving the way government funds community, iwi and Māori organisations



Background

- Project arose as one response to the findings of Community and Voluntary Sector Working party 2001.
- The Working Party identified major issues that needed to be addressed to improve the way government funds and contracts with community, iwi and Maori organisations.
- Established in late 2003 as a mechanism for government agencies to collaborate in contracting with NGO sector.



Background

- An approach that enables integrated services funded by several government (and non-government) agencies to be specified in one contract.
- The FfO project was established to:
 - Speed up process in developing and implementing integrated approaches
 - Reduce compliance costs for providers
 - Identify success factors in achieving improved practices



About Funding for Outcomes

- Has Cabinet mandate
- Works best with groups delivering holistic services to a specific or targeted population.
- Does not bring new funding to participating groups
- Does not seek a 'one size fits all' answer a range of responses will be needed
- Focuses on the results of service delivery "is anyone better off and how"?




Criteria

- Risk assessment does not identify any significant issues
- Has contracts with two or more government agencies
- Delivers services that can be brought together into a coherent package
- FfO Contract Advisor availability
- Provider is Maori, iwi or community based delivering services for clients with multiple needs.
- Contributes to balanced geographical spread




The process involves moving from this...





To this integrated approach...



*Relationship Manager - One agency takes on the relationship manager (lead funder) role: i.e. takes responsibility for ongoing management of the integrated contract and the relationship between provider and funding agencies



Contract Reporting and Monitoring

- Six monthly reporting designed to reflect the full service
- Inclusive of data and narrative
- Reports sent to appointed Relationship Manager who distributes to other funders
- Six monthly Review Meetings



Participants

- Funding for Outcomes Contract Advisor
- Provider
- Funders
- Integrated Contract Relationship Manager nominated to represent funders on issues related to integrated contracts



Benefits

- Fosters and improves collaboration
- Funding is transparent
- Increases sharing of information including a better understanding of co-funders work and the whole service the provider delivers
- Consolidating quality assurance



Benefits

- Better match between what providers do and what's in their contract
- Promoting more effective use of resources
- Clients have a better chance of having all of their needs met
- Contract for three years giving greater certainty



Benefits

- Enables all parties to have a better understanding of the results sought
- Reports better reflecting achievements
- Greater opportunities for strategic planning and staff retention ie 3 year contracts



Tools

- Working Together Charter
- Standard terms and conditions (agreed by all participating Govt. Agencies)
- Long-Form Integrated Contract (over \$200K)
- Short-Form (under 200K)
- Deed of variation



Barriers

- Time intense
- Full engagement of parties
- Contract managers not having mandate
- Pilots and new initiatives
- Databases
- The train carriage effect



Achievements

- Worked with a significant number of government agencies and a small number of nongovernment funders
- 24 integrated contracts currently in place and being monitored six-monthly
- Plus 27 currently in development
- 9 Waiting List
- Approximately 230 contracts into 24 and 27 (above) integrated contracts

- Development and distribution of Integrated Contracts Procedure manual
