

What is an Internal Audit?

A formal, planned and independent check on your management system procedures and processes.

Would you operate your vehicle on the road without having regular safety checks? I.e. WOF.....

Internal audits are nothing more than an internal check on your organisations systems.

It makes **sense** to ensure that your systems are operating effectively!!

What happens after the audit has been conducted?

- Some sort of record of the audit is documented and kept on file.
- •Non conformances and opportunities for improvement are documented.
- Findings are reported to management.

Who can conduct an audit?

Anyone who is deemed competent that has been suitably trained and is independent of the activity being audited.



What is an internal audit?

A formal, planned and independent survey.

It is performed by suitably qualified personnel in accordance with established, documented procedures.

It is used to verify by means of <u>objective evidence</u> that management controls are documented and implemented and meet specified requirements.

Audit findings are recorded and reported to management.
